The Paris Call for the Two-State Solution

12 June 2026

CONCEPT NOTE

One year after the adoption of the New York declaration and the recognition by 10 Western States of the State of Palestine, the implementation of the Two-State solution is still facing important challenges, with a fragile ceasefire in Gaza and the acceleration of the settlement policy in the West Bank. Meanwhile, the outbreak of a regional war has shifted the focus out of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.

In this context, on the one-year anniversary of the Paris Call, which brought together civil society leaders from Israel and Palestine mobilized for the Two-State solution, Foreign Minister Barrot will convene once again civil society leaders alongside international representatives, ahead of the G7 leaders' summit in Evian (France) to deliver an updated call to action.

This call will highlight the importance of a political horizon for Israelis and Palestinians to achieve regional security and integration. It will suggest concrete action to implement the Comprehensive Peace Plan for peace in Gaza and UN Security Council resolution 2803, respond to existential threats to the Two-State solution, and take into account civil society's aspirations to democracy and reform. Additional financial support to civil society will be discussed.

These recommendations, that civil society organizations worked on ahead of the conference, will be structured around 5 themes:

- (i) Security for Israelis and Palestinians**
- (ii) Humanitarian action and reconstruction in Gaza**
- (iii) Implementing the Two-State solution and addressing threats of annexation**
- (iv) Narratives for Peace, democracy and reform**
- (v) Regional integration**

These recommendations will serve as a key milestone ahead of the discussions of the G7 leaders, and will feed into the current diplomatic processes, including the New York Declaration, the Comprehensive Peace Plan, and the Global Alliance for the Two-State solution.
